Introduction

WHAT IS THE INTERNATIONAL YOUTH PARLIAMENT?

The International Youth Parliament is a dynamic global network of creating young people working for social change - people turning ideas into action. Run by and for young people it is a global network of social change leaders working to build a peaceful, sustainable and equitable world.

There are more than 300 delegates from more than 120 countries had participated in Oxfam International Youth Parliament 2004 Future Sustainable Forum in order to listen and learn, to challenge one another and to work together to build and develop their action plan. Amount these more than 300 delegates are students, teachers, farmers, writers, lawyers, poets, artist and doctors. Over eight day that we work together, we have the chance to contribute our experience, present about our action plan and got the feedback, and especially building network in order to achieve our main goal is sustainable change. We all considered and keep in mind that "the Future is our". "Working together to change the world."

AIM & OBJECTIVE OF IYP 2004

This year Oxfam Community Aid Abroad facilitated the world's second International Youth Parliament (IYP 2004) in Sydney, Australia on July 5-12. Over an eight- day program, participants focusing on nine action areas, HIV/AIDS; Labour and employment; Indigenous rights; Sustainable development and agriculture; Peace building; Human rights; Health; Youth Culture and Empowerment and Education, will develop their skills, projects and network for bringing about positive and sustainable change.

The aim of IYP 2004 is Young people working together to create sustainable futures.

In order to achieve this aims, IYP have small objective as following:

- Build strategic networks of young social change leaders, development practitioners, and key decision- makers.
- Increase participants' skills to be effective social change leaders
- Develop frameworks for action to be implemented at local, national and global levels between 2004- 2006
- Motivate, encourage and inspire young leaders to continue working towards building a peaceful, equitable and sustainable world.
- Document key successes, major challenges and recommendations for the future
- Facilitate engagement between global youth leaders and the wider community in Australia and internationally.

I. SUMMARY:

The programs of forum were designed separately as well as commonly for all delegates with the following program and sessions:

1. **Action Area Groups:** It was described as a “home base” of each delegate. It is a space for dialogue, and for sharing the experiences, perspective and knowledge that everyone brings to the issue. This gathering is also the key space for networking and exploring opportunity for collaboration which includes the development of collective or group action plans. There are between 15 up to 25 delegates in each group and assisting by a team of facilitators equal to 4 people.

There are 9 action area groups as following:

- HIV/AIDS
- LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT
- INDIGENOUS RIGHTS
- SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND AGRICULTURE
- PEACE BUILDING
- HUMAN RIGHTS
- HEALTH
- YOUTH CULTURE AND EMPOWERMENT
- EDUCATION

2. **Joint Sitting:** All delegates came to join together in the Br. Emilian Hall of St Joseph College for most of the day of IYP2004 in the morning. During the Joint Sitting, a range of speakers were invited to challenge the delegates to think more deeply about his/her own action plans representing ideas and questions that relate to the cross-cutting themes of IYP2004.

3. **X Group:** After most Joint Sittings all delegates have been separated by groups according to the name assigned. The X Group provides the chance for delegates to discuss and debate issues rose in the Joint Sitting. Actually, we were able to join only 1 time on the last day of the Join Sitting.

4. **Action Area Sharing:** Each action area group share what was happening to other visitors from other action area groups. This is designed to allow the delegates to exchange ideas and what have been discussed in each group.

5. **Regional Meeting:** As the delegates came across every continent of the world and they are in different action area group, therefore the Regional Meeting is aimed to provide the opportunity to delegates who came from the same region like Asia, Europe, America, Pacific, Africa, to discuss what they are interested in and see if there are any opportunities for Collective Action Planning in collaboration on their individual action Plans. The Asia was separated into 2 different groups and the Southeast Asia which I was in, we came up with the idea to create a network among members and prepare the Asia Pacific Youth Parliament following to the International Youth Parliament.

6. **Elective Skill Workshop:** This is the legroom for every delegate to gain more skills and each of delegates has the right to choose only two different elective workshops due to the time limitation. These are the following topics of workshop session:

- Working with the media

- Networking and forming partnerships
- Communicating ideas and developing campaigns
- Conflict resolution and negotiation
- Fundraising
- Advocacy and lobbying
- Facilitation skills
- Project Management
- Budgeting and managing finances
- Monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment.

For me, I have attended two workshops such as Working with the Media and Fundraising.

7. **EXPO:** On Saturday the 10th of July in the afternoon IYP organized the chance to all delegates to meet representatives of International Institutions, founders, no-governmental organizations and other IYP supporters in order to finding supporter or build network with people and organization who can support our work in the future. During this time I met many organization and University agencies, such International Young Professional foundation, Engineering without Border Australia, Oxfam Communities Aid Abroad, United Nations Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM) and MACQUARIE University etc. all these agency promised that they will support all IYP action partners as they can by informing in the website of IYP to all action partners.

II. EDUCATION 1 ACTION AREA IN IYP FORUM:

DAY 1 - MONDAY 5TH JULY 2004

Action Area Group: Meet and get to know our group, discuss the program and establish ways of working. The delegates in the education 1 group participate in one classroom. The facilitators start to collect all delegates ID cards and play one game (Remembering) by sitting as circle and one delegate start to tell his/her own name and the delegate sit next to has to say the delegate's name who had told his/her name and tell hi/her own name, doing like this until the last delegate and the last delegate has to say all delegates name. After that each delegate and facilitators start to know each other by presenting their name (with the meaning of their name), the country they come from, and say one sentence in their own language (eg. ជំរាបសួរ = Hello) one by one to all participants. After finishing presentation the facilitator ask the delegates to see the program in the welcome pack together

Action Area Group: Sharing expectations, issues, action plan ideas and setting our agenda for the next 8 days. The facilitators shares the small color papers to the delegates to write about their expectations of participating in Oxfam International Youth Parliament Future

Sustainable Forum and stick all expectations on the wall and then the facilitator conclude the expectations of the delegates. The facilitators find the partners to all delegates and each partner will present their own action plan to each other. After finish the presentation action plan to the partner, the delegate come together and stand as the circle and the facilitator break the paper, rolling it, and through to one delegate and this delegate will tell about important point of his/her partner's action plan. For example Calose's action plan is to give free for primary school so he create the primary school which didn't charge the money from the pupils, doing like this, he want to show the government that they can do so the government also can do.

Orientation Session to IYP's website and online forum. The delegates join in computer room to learn about online forum.

Night Program

DAY 2 - TUESDAY 6TH JULY

Action Area Group: An introduction to the action planning process and discussion around ideas rose in the joint sitting. Dialogue around the issues and change we want to see in our communities. Spreading in 5 groups and each group will talk about the action plans of each delegate in the group.

Action Area Group: Further analysis of the issues. Exploring our strategies for effecting change (action plans). Identifying barriers and obstacles to change we want to overcome them. Sharing small color papers to the delegates to write their action plan's name and the goal of the action plan, the delegate take the small color paper to stick on the whiteboard in topics that relate to their action plans name and goal. The topics were given are **Marginalized youth/ informal education or night school, Unemployment/ Skill training, Education legislation, Infrastructure, and Critical thinking/ Peace education/ Global Citizenship/ Youth participation.** After that the facilitators break the delegates in to five groups according to the topics that the delegate's action plans related to. Each group will discuss together about each delegate action plans in Obstacles and barriers. The obstacles and barriers were found in the discussion:

- Convincing local government to merit of project (education instruction)
- Time management
- Money funding
- Motivation of victual team / participation
-]Engaging volunteer/doing everything myself
- Team coordination
- Finding stamina/avoiding burnouts
- Being part of large organization (mismatch of vision)
- Pacing
- Promoting an innovative but unproven ideas
- Lack of skill personal
- Model development
- Maintaining growth
- Networking
- Inexperience
- Working virtually/long distance

Regional Metting: All delegates from Southeast Asia joining together in one room. Separating in small groups to discuss about each country problems. As the result we get five problems: Domestic Violence, Health (HIV/AID...), Sexual Trafficking, Education, Labor force)

DAY 4 - THURSDAY 8TH JULY

Action Area Group: Exploring the structural and institutional issues that affect our work for change and the implications for our action plans. Discussion around how young people can influence the global agenda. The delegates in education 1 write their own action plan in brief on the paper and stick it on the wall. After all each delegate in education 1 go to read other delegate's action plans where stick on the wall.)

Action Area Group: Identifying resources and building networks to strengthen our action plans. Playing game. Education 1 delegates share in three groups. The three groups of education 1 exchange to stay in the room.

Education 1 and 2 join together and each delegate get one paper called "Find someone who" delegate have to find the delegate who can do what had written on the paper and write his/her name.

Action Area Sharing: Find out what is happening in the other Action Area Groups. Share what our Action Area Group has been discussing. Exchange ideas; start a Collective Action Plan? Two groups went to visit other group to learn about what they had discussed in their group and one group will stay in education 1 room to meet with the other group that will visit this group in order to share what education 1 had discussed on.

DAY 5 – FRIDAY 9TH JULY 2004

Action Area Group: Action Planning time. Revising, consolidating and documenting our action plan strategies.

DAY 7 - SUNDAY 11TH JULY

Action Area Group: Further consolidation and finalising Action Plans including discussion around strategies for monitoring and evaluating how we are progressing as a network. Discussion around the role of IYP and other Action Partners in achieving our individual and collective action plans. All delegates start to complete their action plan by answer the question on the paper given.

Action Area Group: Further consolidation and finalising Action Plans. All Action Plans (individual and collective) copied for IYP. Each Action Area group prepares their presentation for the final Joint Sitting. (Education 1 and 2 joining together and Sofiya present about the small support that IYP could support. She said that IYP has small support from \$500 to \$5000 to may be 25 action plans. So all action plans that had written to IYP will check and tell which action that IYP will support in October 2004.

Action Area Sharing: Reflection time: What have you learnt? What have we achieved? What remains to be done? Where to from here?

Action Area Group: Discussion around returning home and re-entering our communities. Group farewells. Performing the activity of a role play for education 1 to act in the farewells tomorrow.

Final Night Celebration: Dinner tonight will be held in the Br Emilian Hall. Famous Sydney band Sol Veneno played, along with a DJ. Dancing in the great hall.

DAY 8 - MONDAY 12TH JULY

The final day of IYP2004 was a chance to share our ideas for action. We also learnt more about the opportunities that exist as an IYP action partners. The session concluded with a ceremonial closing presentation. All action group present and sharing what they have been developed in their action group in to make the sustainable change. All this issues were consisted in one role play to present to the Joint Sitting. This session also showed the fifteen delegates who were elected amount 300 people to be the international steering committee of International Youth Parliament. The purpose of creating this steering committee is the follow up the action after IYP. Farewells, packing up, photos and free time. Sharing IYP package. Final Lunch followed by departures.

As action partner, Oxfam will introduce our action plan to donor or apply for small grant from them.

IV. FUTURE PROGRAM OF IYP2004 AFTER FORUM:

Since the limitation of time for every action partners to meet each other and in order to ensure the continuity of each action partner in their own action plan toward creating a sustainable future IYP2004 has its Post IYP2004 Program of Action (2004-2006) which aims to support every action partner in his/her efforts to build a sustainable future for his/herself and his/her community. The programs include:

1. **The Action Plan Support Program:** Providing strategic and financial support for action partners' work toward a sustainable future.
2. **The Skills Development Program:** Providing access to skills resources and in-line learning programs to improve his/her effectiveness as a social change leader.

3. **Ongoing Networking and Alliance Building Initiatives:** Providing each action partner with ongoing opportunities to build strategic networks and alliances to support his/her work.
4. **Research and Information Exchange Initiatives:** Sharing across the IYP network of learning, information and research relating to the issues that face young people and the actions they have taken for positive and sustainable change.

VI. CONCLUSION

The Oxfam International Youth Parliament (OIYP) Sustainable Future 2004 was a great event I ever attended. I was really impressed by the way this event was organized, its programs and delegates' participation.

In the OIYP Future Sustainability Forum, I have gained lot of new knowledge and experiences that are necessary for me to develop myself and my organization toward serving the best interest of children and youth in Cambodia. APPENDIX

JOIN SITTING:

DAY 1 - 5TH JULY 2004: WELCOME ADDRESS, SYDNEY TOWN HALL. This official ceremony in present of **Honorary Bob Carr**, Premier of New South Wales, Mr. **Mark Yettica-Paulson**, CEO of the Australian Indigenous Leadership Centre, **Patrick Dodson**, First chairperson of the Council for Reconciliation, and **Nicole Breeze**, the Oxfam International Youth Parliament Coordinator.

Mr. Carr said that “The most important issue for our generation is global warming. It reminds us that the religious divisions and the divisions of the nation states and ideologies are unimportant. All the differences are overridden by our common humanity and that common humanity is to occupy the planet we own”.

Guest Speakers included:

Patrick Dodson, who is widely referred to as "the father of Reconciliation in Australia." Patrick spent 6 year as the inaugural Chair of the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation and was a royal commissioner in the important national Inquiry into Aboriginal Deaths in custody. Patrick's work in reconciliation has taken him to many part of the world and he is regarded as one of Australia's most eloquent voices in peace, justice, human rights and reconciliation. He agreed that environmental issues are of great importance, but said it is the human beings that live in those environments who matter, he mention that “Changing things is not easy. Accepting change is not easy. But pursuing it for the good of other human beings and to create a good society in which other human beings can live in is absolutely one of the most worthy causes that you an dedicate your life to,”. “Youth are the leaders of today, not tomorrow. We are assets not liabilities, we are solutions and not a problem to be solved ... let’s give in to it my friends” said Ms. Breeze, “and let the games begin!”

Stanley Simpson, a delegated from Fiji to the first sitting on the Oxfam International Youth Parliament in 2000 and invited as facilitator in Second IYP shared his experiences about first IYP. “Going to Sydney in 2000 for the first IYP sitting was amazing. Everyone I met had something valuable to say” he said. Stanley called on the young leaders to embrace their opportunity to be involved in the second sitting of IYP. “Don’t let this opportunity pass you by without making full use of it, you may never get the opportunity to be among such imminent and extraordinary people again,”... “The core characteristic here is belief, we’ve got to believe in ourselves and each other, we’ve got to believe that our being here is not an accident but a result of what we have an achieved and an opportunity to build ourselves toward better and great things,” he said.

Nicole Breeze, the International Coordinator of the Oxfam International Youth Parliament, state that all the young people who participant in IYP 2004 because of the vision that you hold for a better world and because of the skill commitment and creativity that you possess to make that vision real. Second IYP is much more than a conference or meeting. It is the beginning of a two year program of social action and leadership development, through which we will work together to build a peaceful, equitable and sustainable world.

Therefore after IYP 2004, every delegated got individual developed action plan and submitted to Oxfam International Youth Parliament in order finding support, technical and funding, for running and make their vision came true. We hope that in two year, 2005-06, our action plan will change our communities, target areas, to reach the goal that we want is sustainable future of youth and their families.

DAY 2 - TUESDAY 6TH JULY: WANT TO CHANGE THE WORLD? All delegates were confronted with challenges and realities that are associated with achieving sustainable social change. Key speaker for this session were:

Mr. Jame Arvnitakis, Lecturer in Social Inquiry at the University of Technology, Sydney, warned: “If we ignore consequences, at best we miss important opportunities to network and learn. At worst we re-establish the uneven power relationships that exist.” Mr Arvanitakis delivered an important message to delegates, saying that despite universal commerce “there is a more important resource and [that is] hope. It’s in your faces, hearts and minds.” He added, “It is the most powerful commodity and people have chosen to invest it in you.”

Mr. Patrick Mpedzisi, IYP facilitator from Zimbabwe encourage all people to build the network and keep in mind about your difference background when develop our action plan because we worked and committed together in order to make change.

Ms. Linda Kelly, Development Consultant, reminded delegates about the need to check good intentions and plans: “It’s not just about achieving objectives and the positive things people say about your work. It’s about the difference in peoples lives that can be attributed to you.” Therefore running the action plan should think about the rout to sustainable action is “Think, Plan and Reflection”.

DAY 3 - WEDNESDAY 7TH JULY: POWER AND PARTICIPATION. This Joint Sitting focused on the participation and reminds all delegates thinking about the person who affected, benefits, loses, decides and how important is consultation and what does it really mean? When you want your action plan reach the affect change.

Ms. Julie Morgan, key speaker, urged delegates to question about the power structure in their own countries in order to find out who we start to influence for change. In order to know about the power structure we should make the observation and finding, in event the listening to the other is one most important things.

Mr. Ingrid Macdonald and Ms. Bhanumanthi Kalluri are also the key speaker who present and sharing their experience how to encourage the women participate in our changing program and got the power, women right.

DAY 4 - THURSDAY 8TH JULY: LOCAL SOLUTIONS GLOBAL IMPACT. Delegates were challenged to ‘think big’ about how to use their action plans to make change happen from the grassroots all the way to the top. Change can happen in local cooperation or it can happen at the United Nations.

Eileen Pittaway, lecturer from the University of New South Wales and representative from the Centre for Refugee Research, encouraged delegates to consider using the United Nations (UN) as a tool for implementing their strategies for change. With over 40 years’ experience in activism, Eileen shared an inspiring experience about her work with the UN, which demonstrated how the power of grassroots campaigning can be used to create significant social change.

Delegates were responsive to Eileen’s calls for action and some stood up to express their own ideas and questions about the role of the UN. Some challenged the authority of the UN as an effective instrument for social change while others inquired how they could use the UN to make changes in their own communities. Eileen used this discussion to deliver an important message to delegates; not to give up. “There’s no magic answers and I think this youth parliament is a huge step forward because it’s helping you as young leaders to form the networks you need to become stronger leaders in the future,” she said. Reflecting on the role and critical lessons learnt by Oxfam, Director of Public Policy and Outreach **James Ensor** said that “Change can and must happen. The current patterns of globalisation are unethical and they are unsustainable,” he said.

DAY 6 - SATURDAY 10TH JULY THE FUTURE IS OURS FORUM: WORLD'S YOUTH SETTING AN AGENDA FOR CHANGE

The future is ours forum, delegates take the floor and describe their vision for a more peaceful, equitable and sustainable world and the practical steps that they are taking to
